

Complaints to the BBC: June 2016

The BBC answered just over **18,500** complaints from the audience during June 2016. These ranged from a small number of complaints about alleged breaches of editorial guidelines through to a much larger collection of views about programme content and services.

Topics raised this month included complaints from viewers who felt BBC News devoted too much coverage to the death of Muhammad Ali. We also received complaints about the changes to the BBC One schedule on the 4 June, in order show 'Muhammad Ali: The Greatest'.

Coverage of Wimbledon saw complaints from some viewers who were unhappy with the commentary during the match between Novak Djokovic and James Ward on 27 June

Finally, there were complaints about Newnight's interview with Crispin Blunt MP on 29 June from viewers who felt the tone was too robust.
